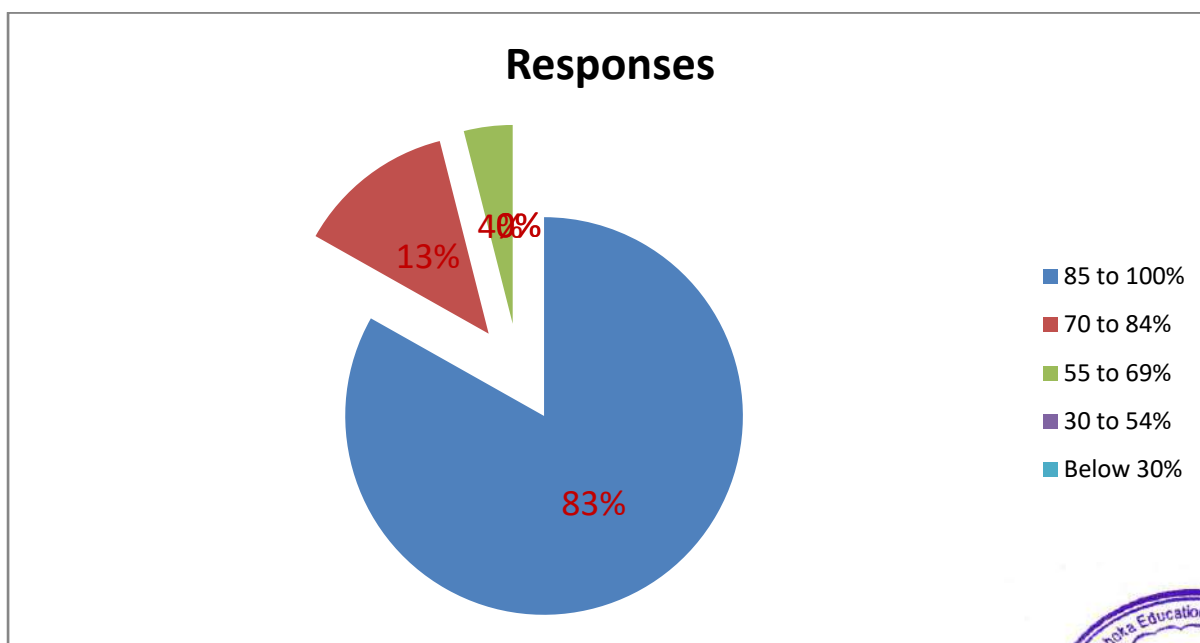


Student Satisfactory Survey Report Academic Year - 2017-19

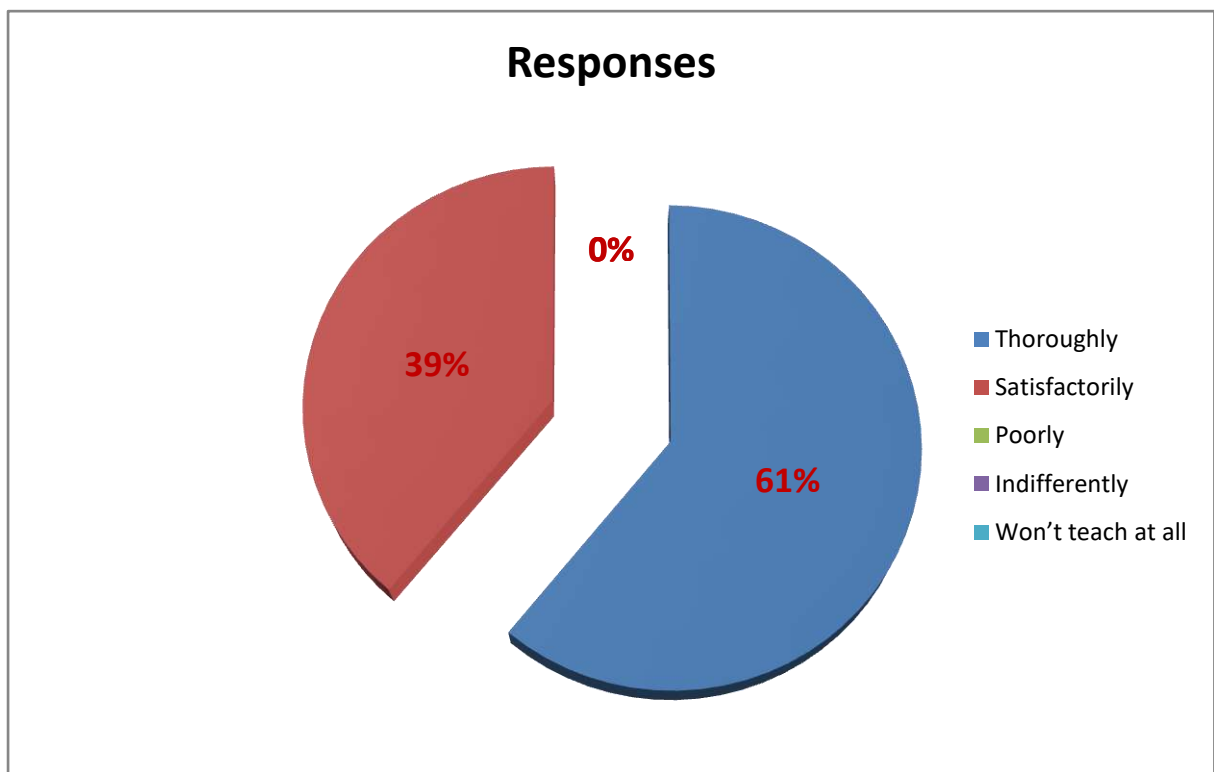
1. How much of the syllabus was covered in the class?

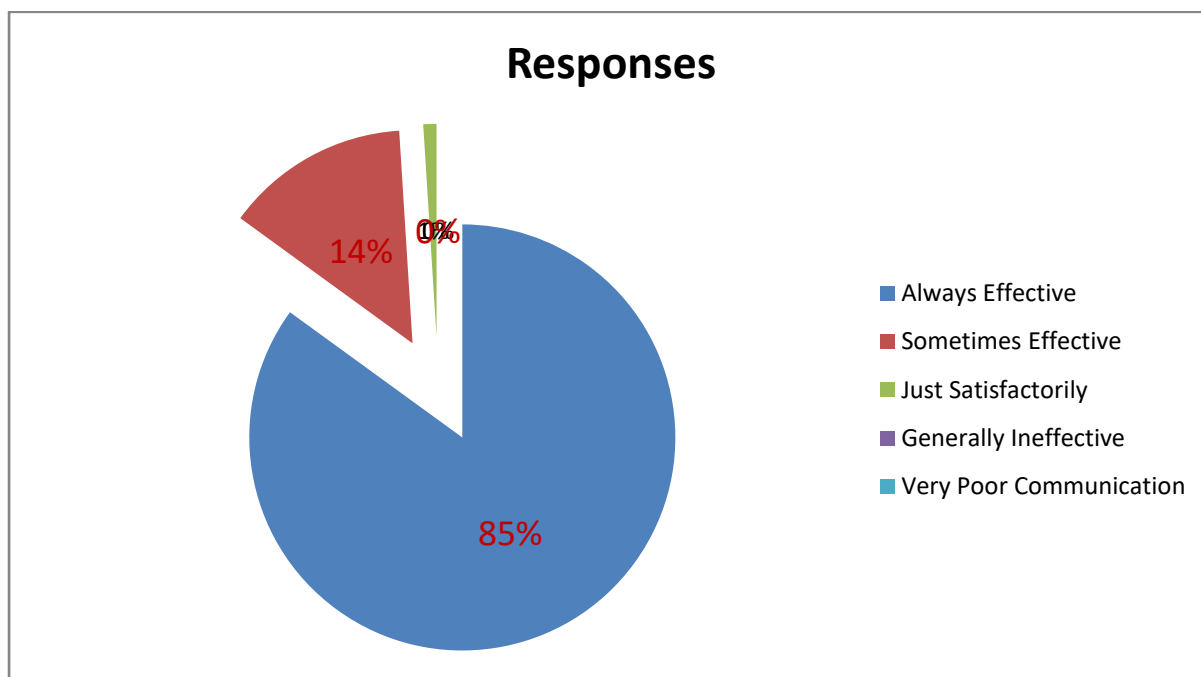

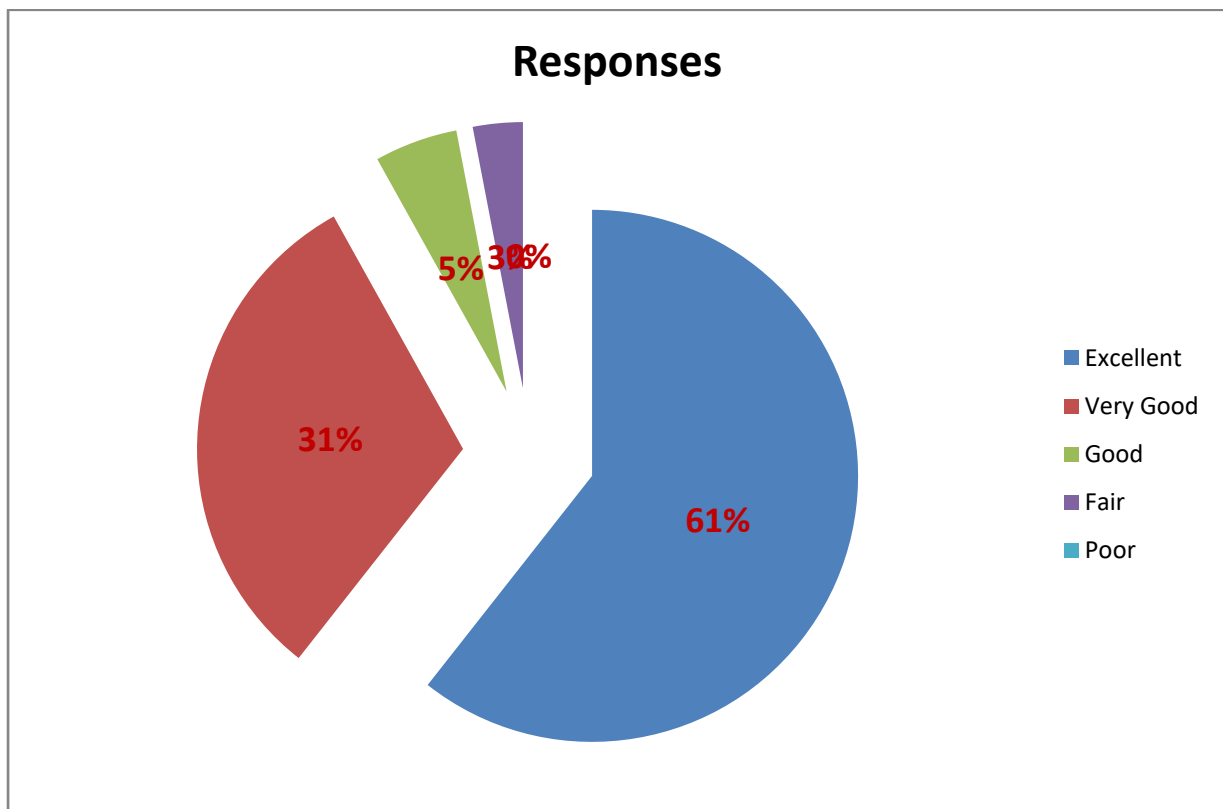

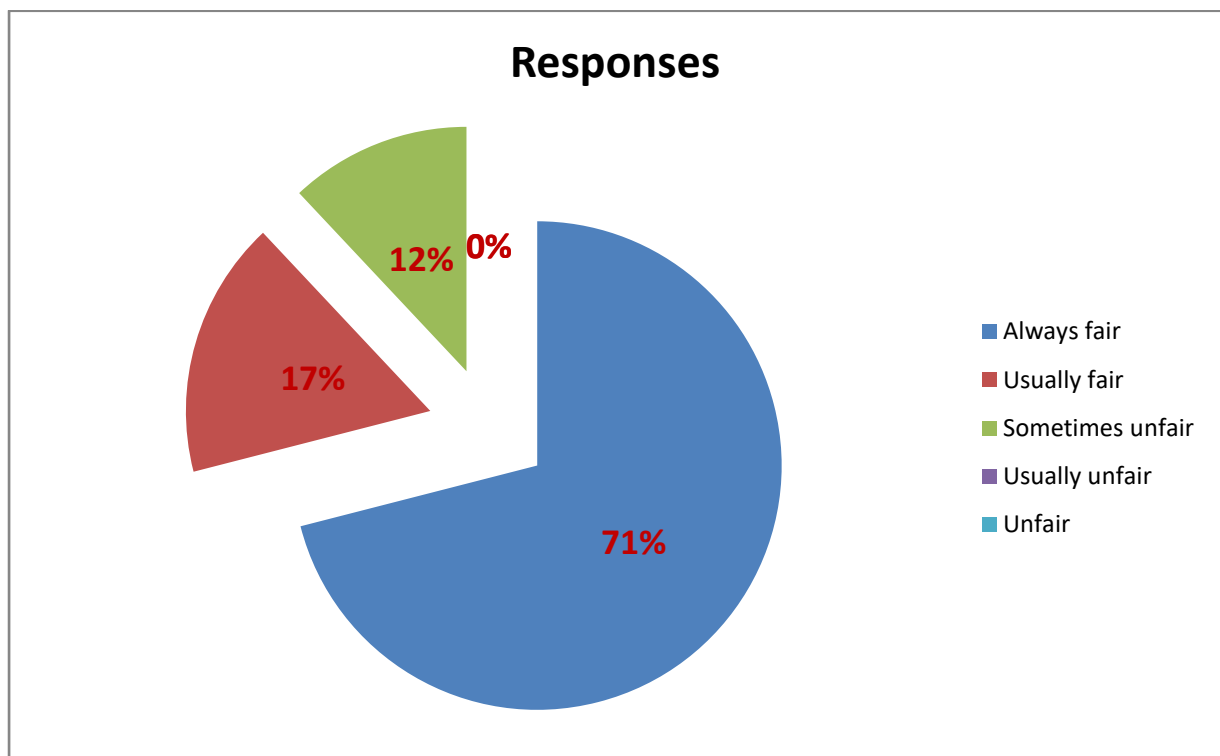

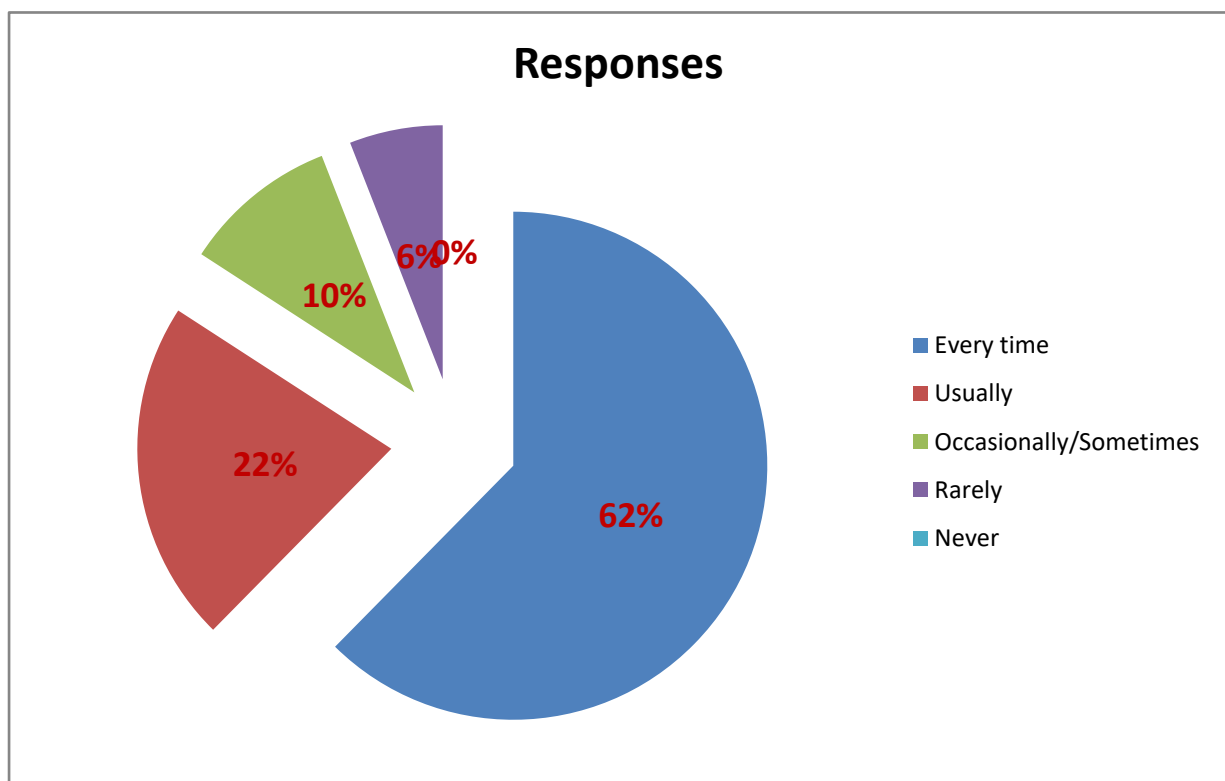

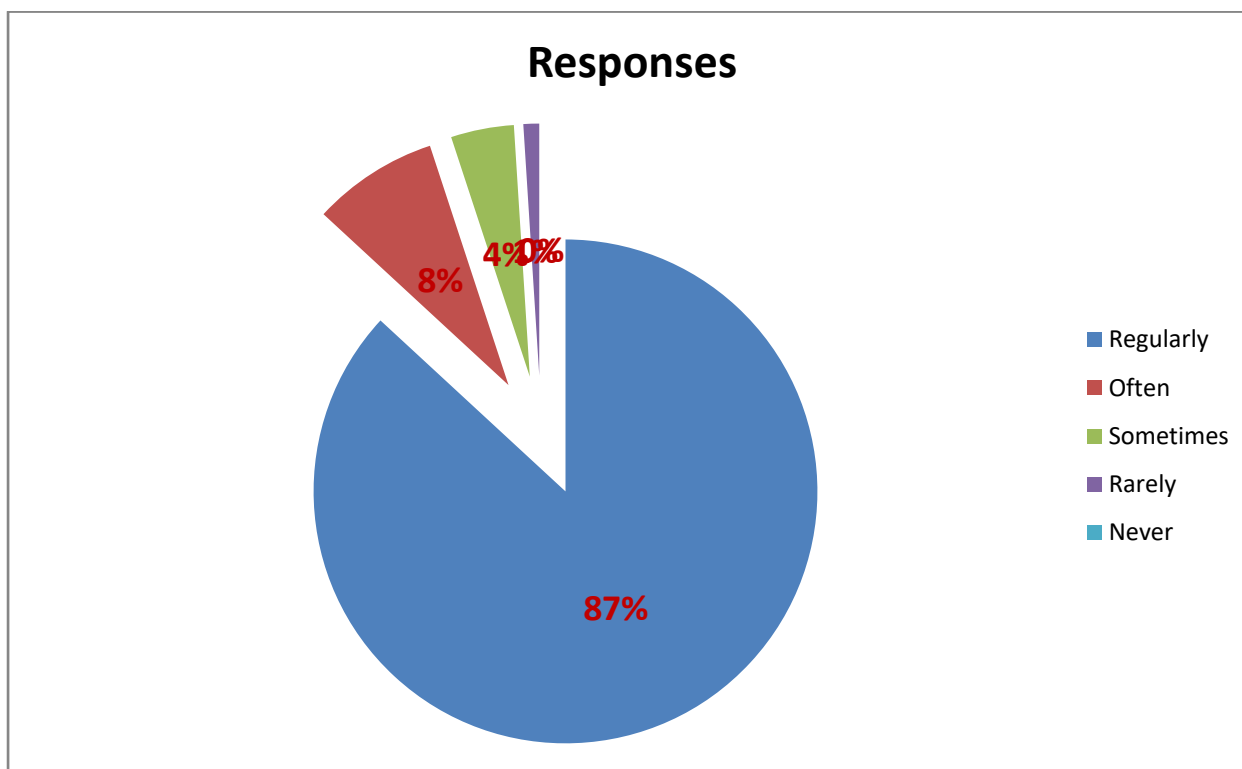

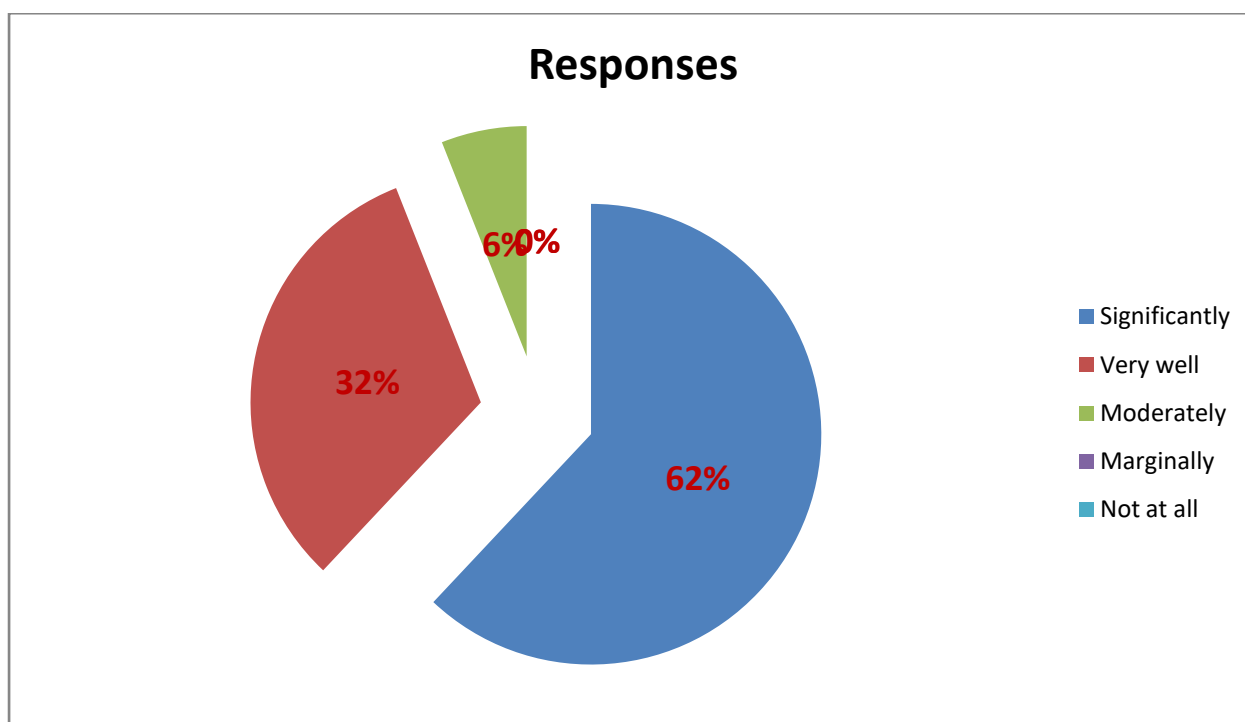

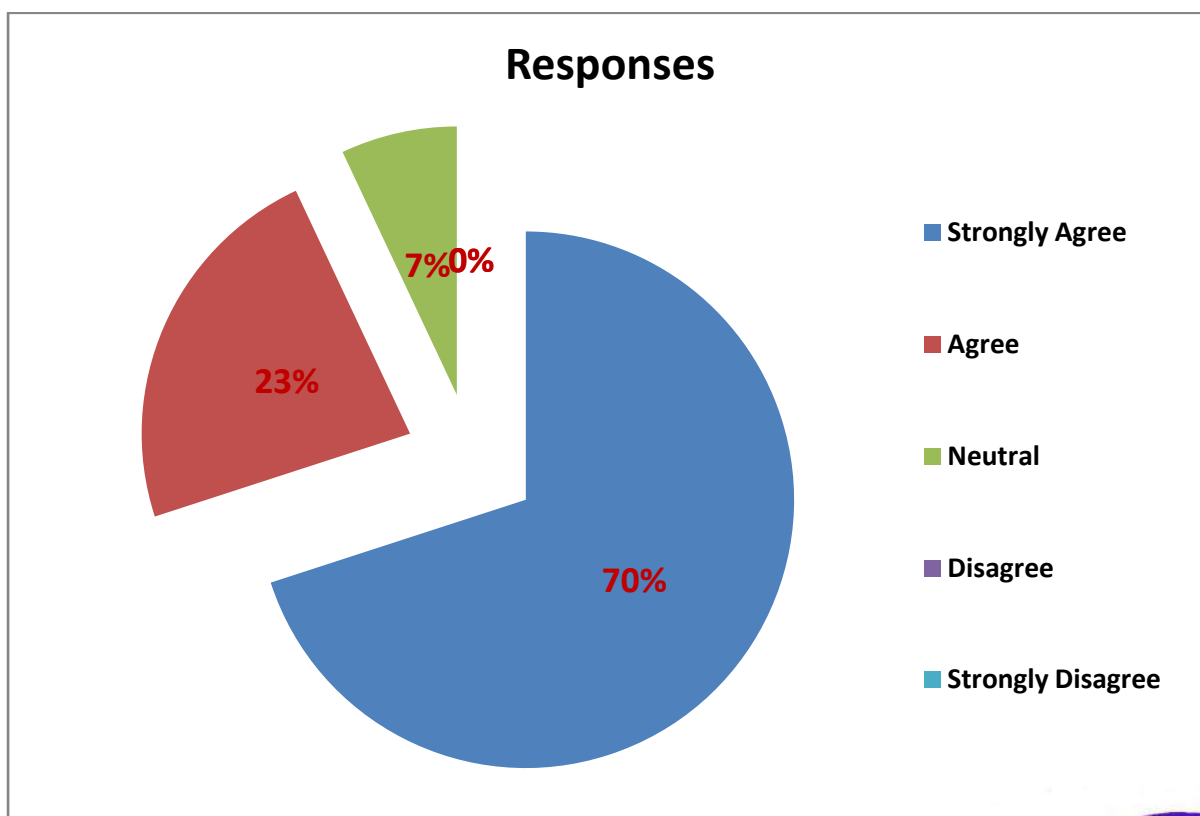

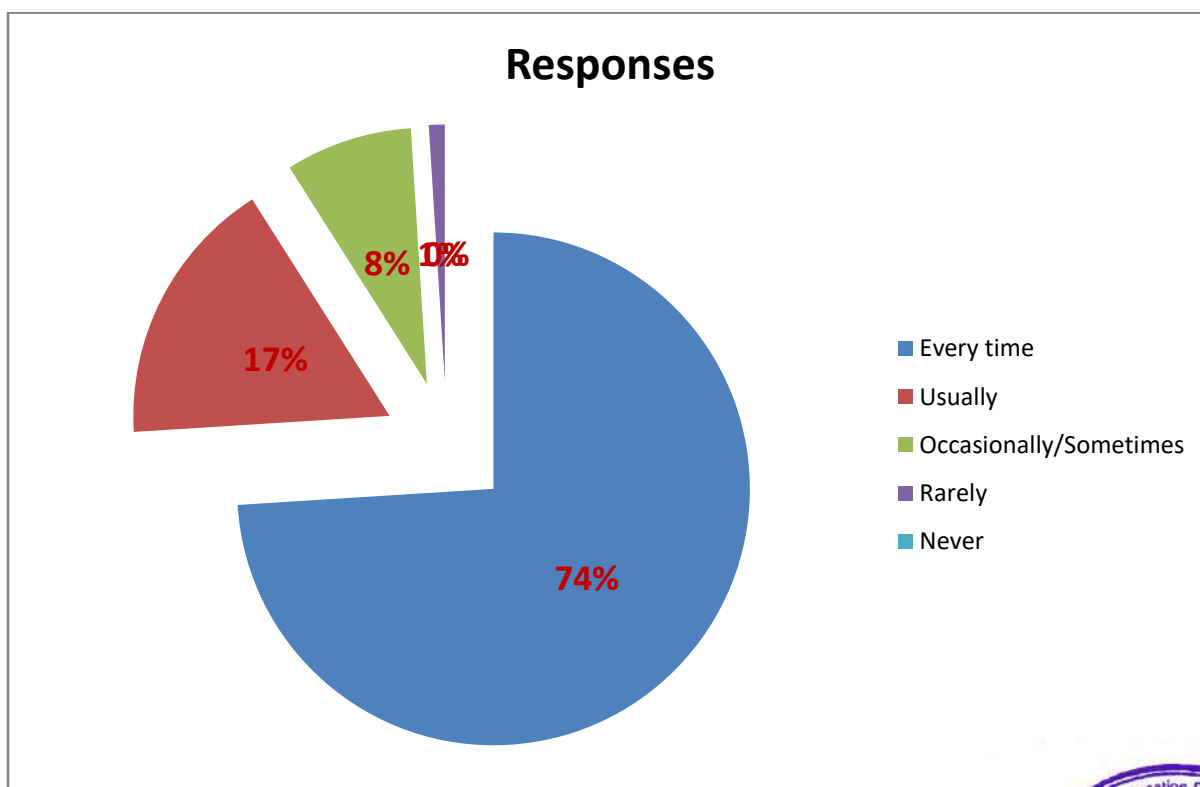

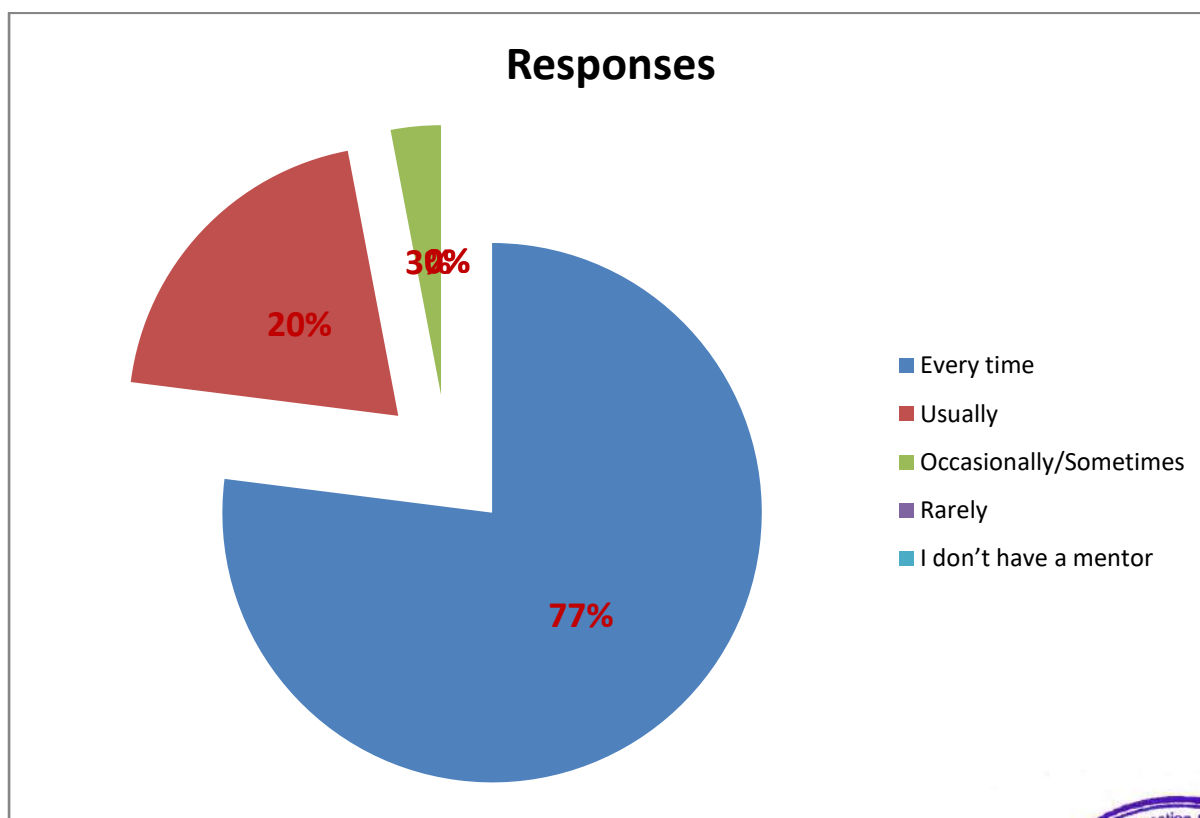

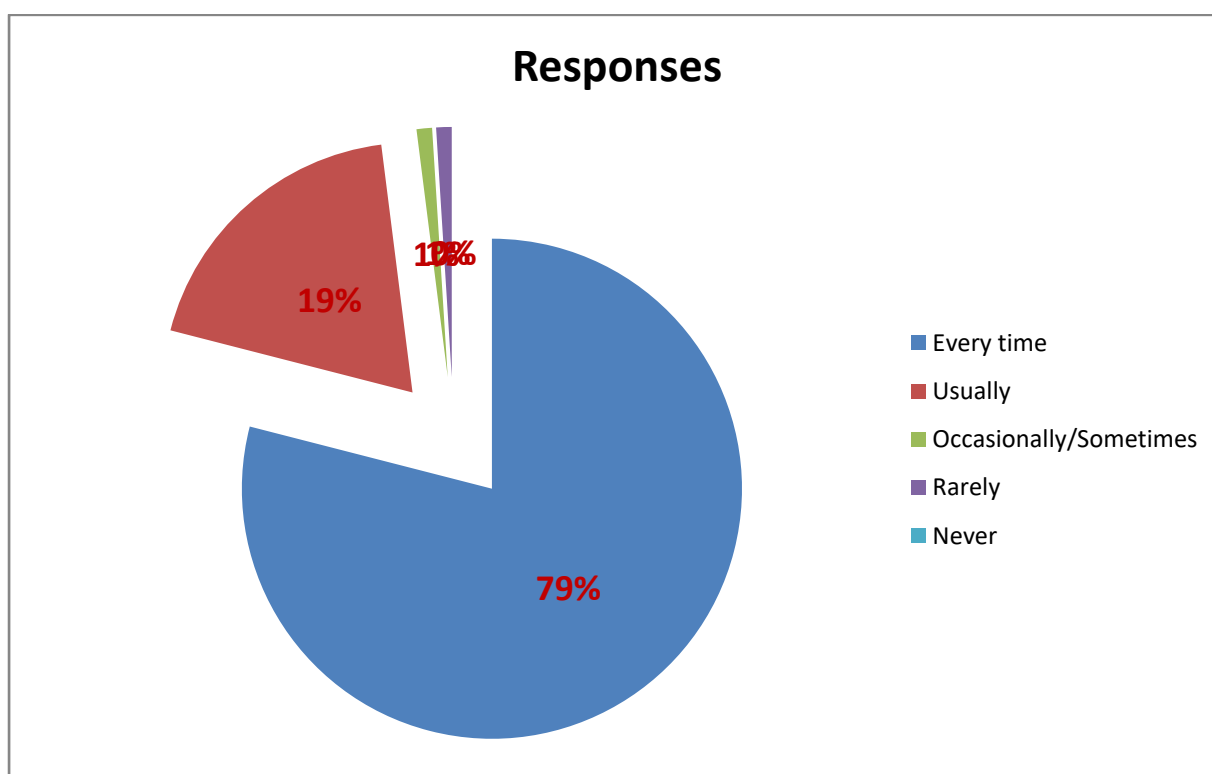

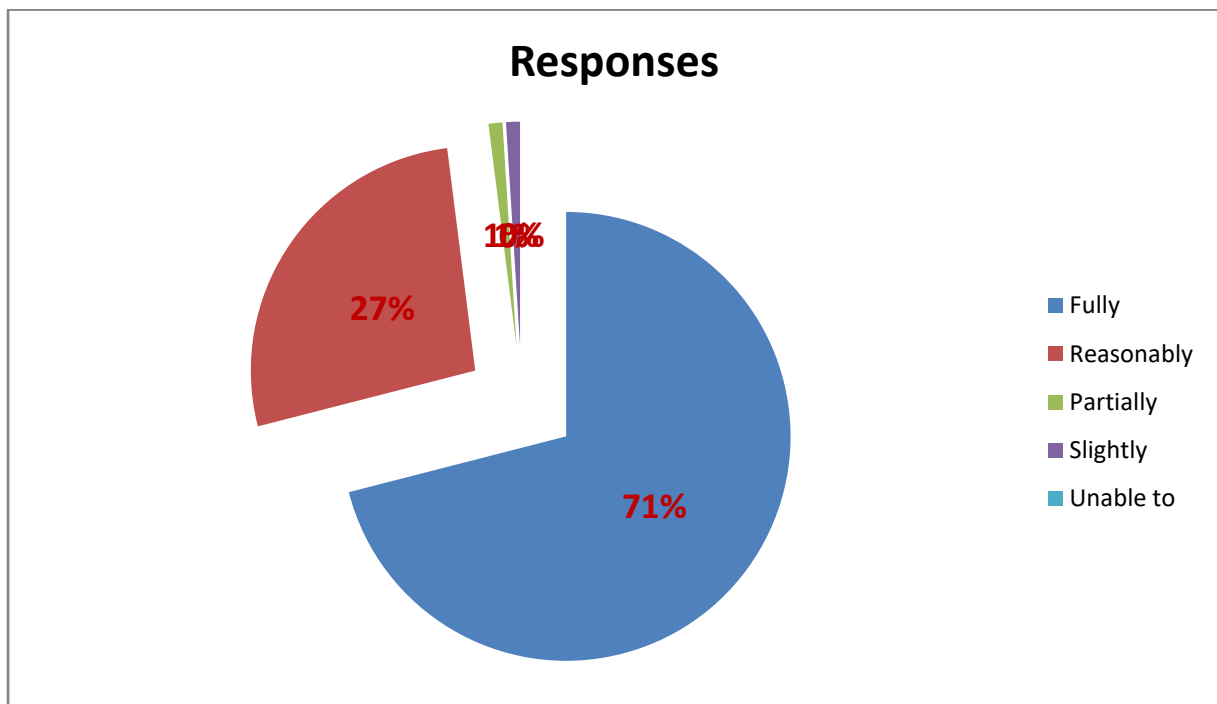

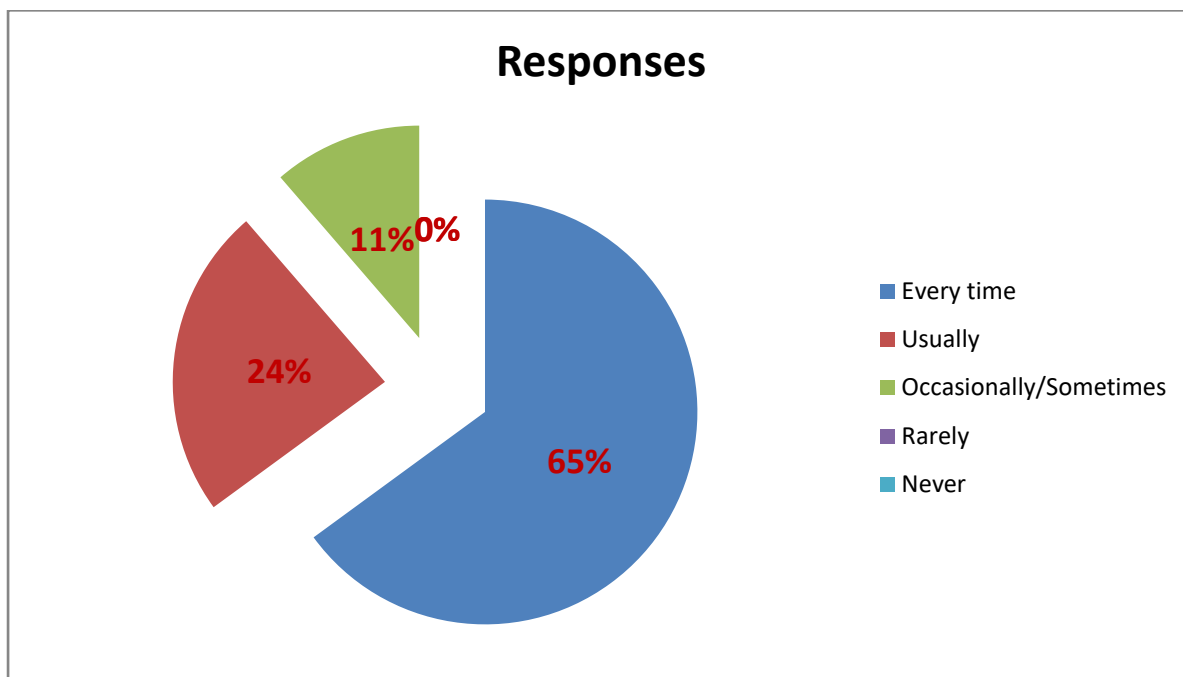

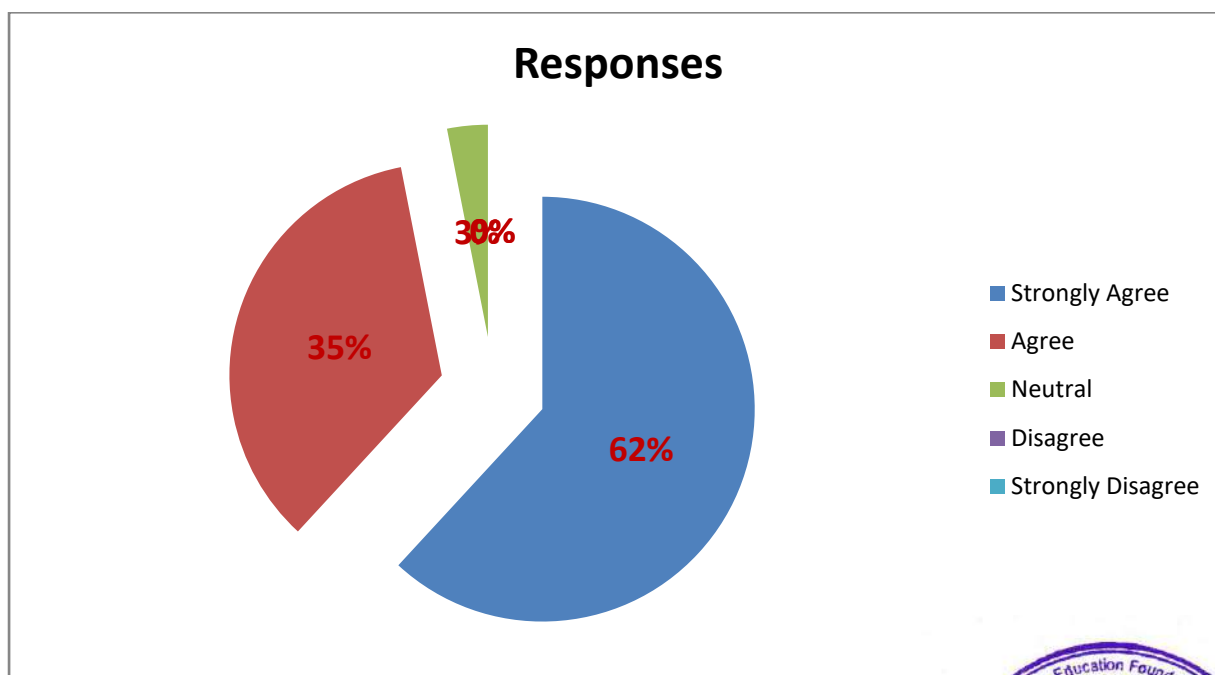

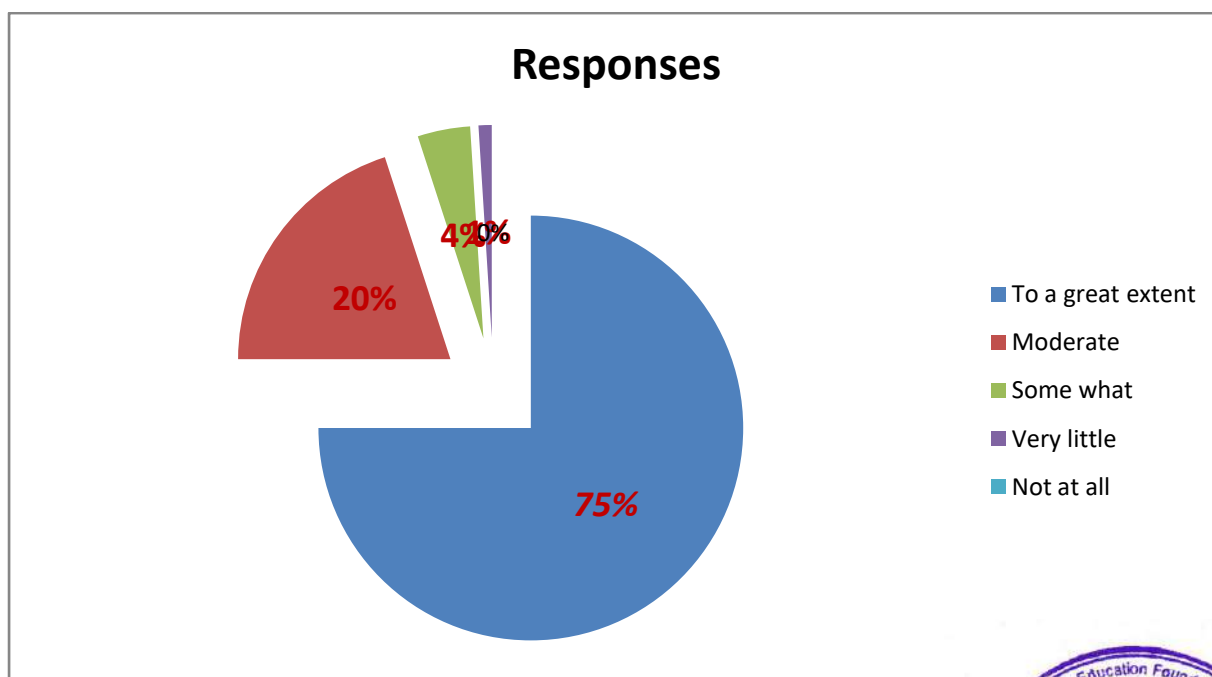

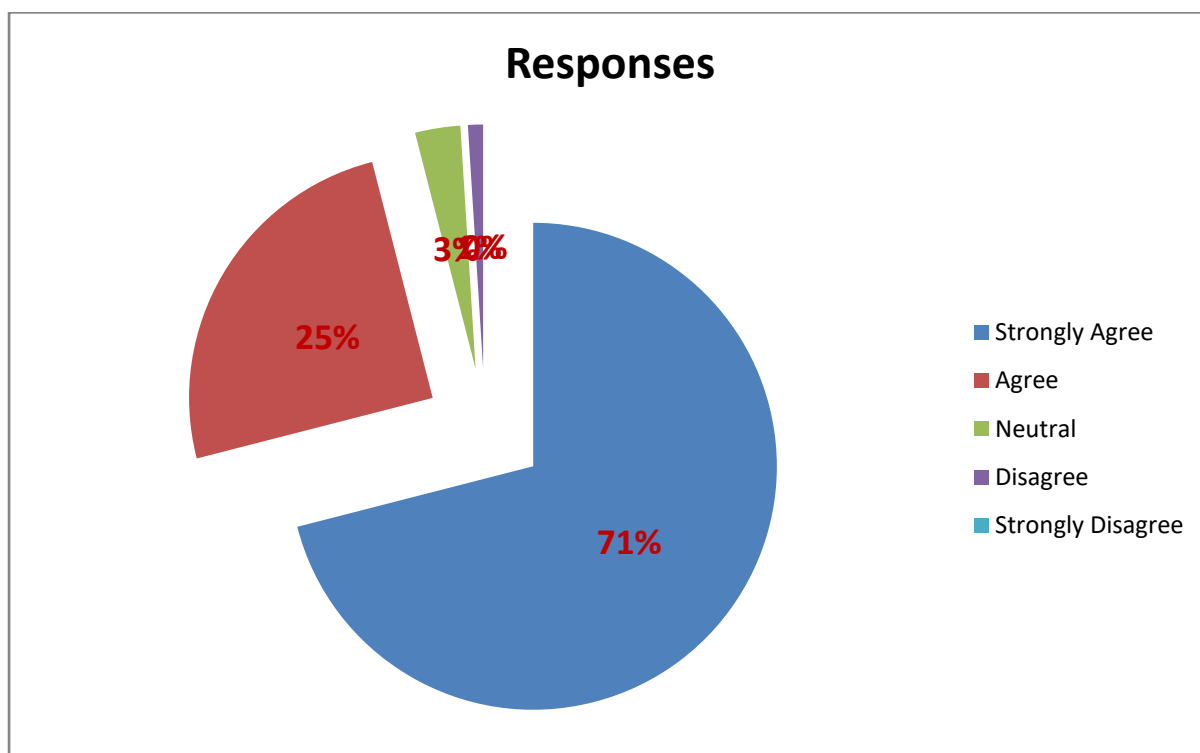

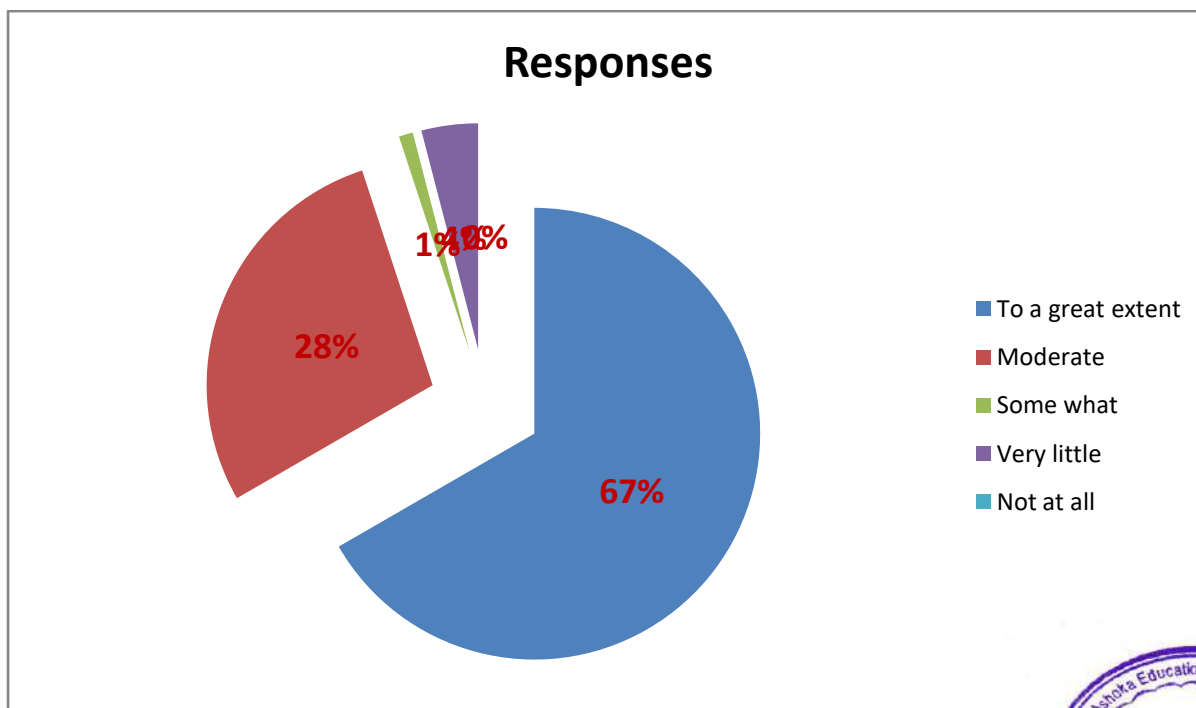

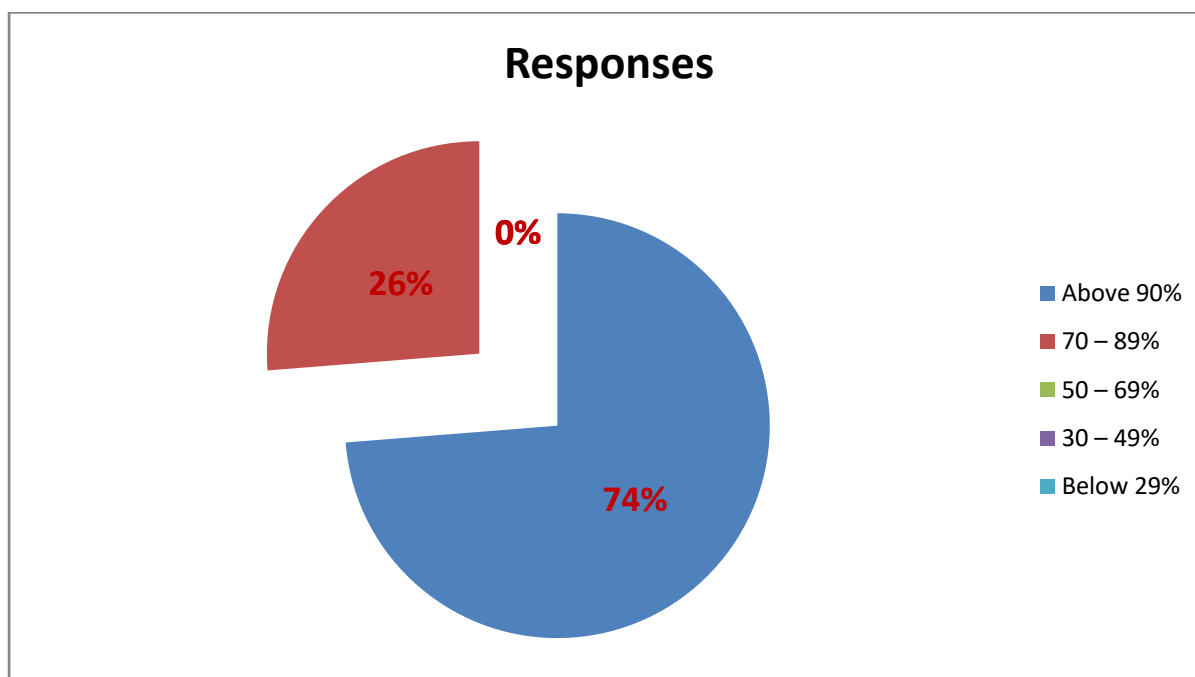

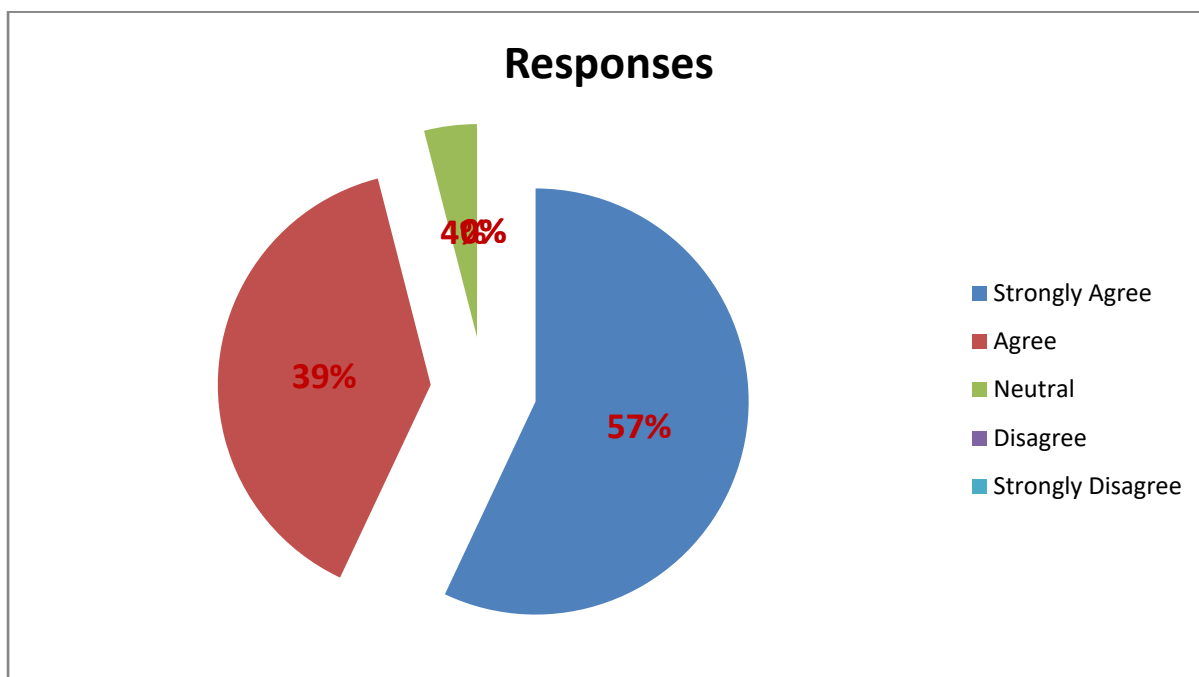
